Articles with names

(from Smyth)

Since personal names are individual they generally do not need the article.

However, they are found with the article when:

- a) They have been previously mentioned (the anaphoric article).
- b) They are famous (ὁ τῶν ἑπτὰ σοφώτατος Σόλων)

Names of deities also omit the article unless emphatic ($v\dot{\eta} \tau \dot{o}v \Delta i\alpha$) or when definite cults are referred to ($\tau \dot{o} \tau \eta \varsigma A \theta \eta v \hat{a} \varsigma \xi \delta o \varsigma$)
