Impersonal passives: Used for intransitive verbs with dative objects

Ablative of agent usually used

Sometimes used with other verbs: focus on verbal action

I spare you: Tibi parcō

You are spared by me: Tibi ā mē parcitur

I am spared by you: Mihi ā tē parcitur

I was spared by you: Mihi ā tē parsum est

We must spare you: Tibi ā nōbīs parcendum est

A battle is being fought at home: Domī pūgnātur

The battle was fiercely fought: Ācriter pūgnātum est

People are running to the country house: Ad villam curritur
