έξ Ἰθάκης γένος εἰμί, πατὴρ δέ μοί ἐστιν Ὀδυσσεύς,

I am from Ithaca by birth and my father is Odysseus

ήν περ γὰρ κεῖταί γε τελεσφόρον εἰς ἐνιαυτόν, αἰεὶ τῷ γ' έσται χρως έμπεδος, ἡ καὶ ἀρείων.

Even if he lies here for a whole year, his flesh will stay the same.

Homer Iliad 19.32-33
